New ILRF Report Supports Palm Oil Workers' Call for Reforms

Hundreds of palm oil workers and their allies <u>crashed the 11th annual</u> <u>meeting of the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO)</u> in Medan, Indonesia, this week. RSPO is a multi-stakeholder organization that promotes so-called "sustainable" palm oil, <u>though research published today by ILRF and Sawit Watch</u> reveals wide-spread abuses, including bonded labor, child labor, union suppression and land grabs. The workers, led by an alliance of labor unions and community organizations called Serbundo, presented a list of demands to RSPO Secretary General Darrell Webber.



Colombian Trade Unionist Assassinated, Others Face Immediate Risk

Oscar López Triviño was murdered on Nov. 9 in the Colombian city of Bugalagrande a day after he and other members of his union, SINALTRAINAL, received death threats from paramilitaries. The union had been on hunger strike at Nestlé beginning Nov. 5. ILRF joins with the United Workers Center (CUT), the Industrial Union of Food Workers (IUF) and unions around the world in condemning this assassination of yet another Colombian trade unionist and calls on the government to swiftly bring the perpetrators to justice through a full and transparent investigation, and to provide all necessary security for other union members at high risk. Send a message to the Colombian authorities demanding justice.



Pay the People who Feed us a Just Wage

This Thanksgiving, say "thanks" to the workers who put the food on your table by signing a petition calling for a rise in the minimum wage that many food workers earn. More than 20 million people work in the food system in the United States (farmers, processors, cooks, servers, etc.), where the median wage is only \$9.90 an hour. The federal minimum wage for tipped workers is only \$2.13 – and hasn't increased in more than 20 years! Sign the petition to raise the minimum wage today and help these workers earn a decent living.



Airline Workers in Philippines Reach Victory

Two years ago, when 2,600 groundcrew workers were locked out and fired from their jobs, ILRF joined the boycott of Philippine Airlines, in solidarity with members of the Philippine Airlines Employees' Association (PALEA). We brought Gerry Rivera, the head of the union, to the US for a speaking tour and through our Labor Rights Defenders Program, helped raise funds to sustain the protest. We are now announcing an end to the boycott, as the airline and union finally reached a settlement agreement today. PALEA members will be rehired as regular employees and receive an improved offer. We congratulate PALEA on their perseverance in this struggle against outsourcing: It took months and months of camping out near the Manila airport and solidarity actions in a number of cities to bring about this victory.



Hold Walmart Accountable for Bad Behavior Around the Globe

Black Friday – the biggest Walmart shopping day of the year – is coming up, and it's time to tell Walmart that enough is enough. Join Walmart workers and activists around the world to demand Walmart respect its workers and pay fair wages. Take part in the Global Week of Action Nov. 18-24. 
